

## Government advice on the easing of Covid restrictions in schools:

Please see below guidance we have received from the Department of Education & Skills about the easing of Covid restrictions in post primary schools.

- The Government has accepted the recommendations of NPHET to remove remaining restrictions relating to maskwearing and physical distancing in schools. Schools should now resume normal school routines and normal teaching and learning activities.
- The suite of measures set out in the
   Framework for physical distancing at post primary schools included, reconfiguring class spaces to maximise physical distancing; reviewing timetables, use of live streaming within the school; and accessing available spaces within the local community. As the general requirement for physical distancing no longer applies, schools are no longer required to maintain these arrangements.
- Use of changing rooms, PE halls and lockers, staff rooms etc. can resume where schools have curtailed access to these facilities.
- Students can continue to wear their PE gear to school on the days that they are timetabled for PE and / or a sports related module.
- The staggered breaks & lunches will continue to the end of the year as they are built into the timetable.



**Government advice on the easing of Covid** restrictions in schools:

- The staggered end to the school day will cease as and from Monday. All year groups will finish at 3.55pm apart from First and Fourth Year students who can finish at 3.50pm.
- It is no longer a requirement for staff or students to wear a mask in school. Staff and students can continue to wear a mask if they wish to do so. Schools should continue to make masks available on request as they are currently doing.
- With effect from Monday 28 February the wearing of face coverings/masks on school transport will no longer be mandatory but will continue to be advised. All other measures relating to hygiene (including the provision of hand sanitiser and additional cleaning of service) and pre-assigned seating will remain in place subject to further review
- Schools should continue to promote good hygiene. Hand hygiene can be achieved by hand washing or use of a hand sanitiser (when hands look clean).
- The requirement to stay at home if you have symptoms remains, both for students and staff. One of the key messages to manage the risks of COVID-19 is to do everything practical to avoid the introduction of COVID-19 into the school.

## State Examination Oral & Music Practical Exams

The State Examinations Commission has issued Circular S90/21'Important Announcement in Relation to Oral Tests in Irish and Modern Foreign languages and the Music Practical Examinations for Leaving Certificate 2022' https://www.examinations.ie/misc-doc/EN-EX-14529694.pdf.

The circular sets out the following key provisions in relation to the timing of these tests, preliminary information in relation to arrangements, recruitment of examiners, and supports for schools:

- For the 2022 Leaving Certificate, the Oral language tests and the Leaving Certificate Music Practical examination will be conducted in the Easter holiday period using a revised 6-day model to run from Saturday 9th April to Thursday 14th April
- Schools will have some flexibility if there is a particular day over the six days on which tests cannot be held due to local needs.
- The tests will be conducted by visiting examiners, recruited, and appointed to schools by the SEC
- If it is not possible to facilitate all of the tests in the 6-day period, two contingency days have been identified as Thursday 7th and Friday 8th April 2022.

The State Examinations Commission will issue a more detailed circular in January 2022 with further details of these arrangements including details in relation to the management of the tests during the 6-day period over the Easter holidays.



### **Attendance**

If you know your son / daughter will be absent please email: office@olss.ie with a brief message outlining the reason for the absence. If your son / daughter is absent and we do not receive prior notification parents / guardians will receive a notification via the school app. It is very important that all parents click the Yes / No option to confirm that they are aware of the reason for this absence.





## **Mobile Phones in School**

- Mobile Phones in School: See below updated guidelines for the use of mobile phones in school.
- Before school, break / lunch and after school
- Students mobile phones should be switched off at all times before school, during break / lunch and after school while on the school premises.
- Students are not allowed access to their phones before school, during break / lunch and after school while on the school premises. If a student is using their mobile phone without permission on the school premises it may be confiscated for the student and / or parent / guardian to collect in the school office at the end of the day.
- Students are not allowed access to their mobile phones during evening study.
   Chromebooks will be provided to students who require access to Google Classroom.





#### **Mobile Phones in School**

#### **In Class**

#### **First Year**

- Student mobile phones should be switched off at all times in class.
- Students are not allowed to use their mobile phone for any activity in class. (students will have access to the school chromebooks for all ICT teaching & learning activities)
- If a student is using their mobile phone without permission in class it may be confiscated for the student and / or parent / guardian to collect in the school office at the end of the day.
- If a student asks permission to leave the class to use the bathroom or go on a message they will be asked to leave their mobile phone on their desk before they do so.

#### **Seccond Year**

- Student mobile phones should be switched off at all times in class.
- Students are not allowed to use their mobile phone for any activity in class. (students will have access to the school chromebooks for all ICT teaching & learning activities)
- If a student is using their mobile phone without permission in class it may be confiscated for the student and / or parent / guardian to collect in the school office at the end of the day.
- If a student asks permission to leave the class to use the bathroom or go on a message they will be asked to leave their mobile phone on their desk before they do so.



#### **Third Year**

- Student mobile phones should be switched off at all times in class unless directed by the class teacher.
- Students may be allowed to use their mobile phone in class to complete work and access material relevant to CBA's, exams etc if they cannot do this work on the school chromebooks or in the computer rooms. If the use of mobile phones in class is essential to the aforementioned work the classroom teacher will email smt@olss.ie in advance of this activity outlining the class group and the nature of the work to be covered with the mobile phone. When using their mobile phones in class students will follow the guidelines below.
- If a student is using their mobile phone without permission in class it may be confiscated for the student and / or parent / guardian to collect in the school office at the end of the day.
- If a student asks permission to leave the class to use the bathroom or go on a message they will be asked to leave their mobile phone on their desk before they do so.





#### **Fourth Year**

- Student mobile phones should be switched off at all times in class unless directed by the class teacher.
- All students have a school chromebook and this should be the preferred option for students in class.
- If students have to use their mobile phones for an activity that cannot be completed on the chromebooks the students will follow the guidelines outlined below.
- If a student is using their mobile phone without permission in class it may be confiscated for the student and / or parent / guardian to collect in the school office at the end of the day.

#### Fifth Year

- Student mobile phones should be switched off at all times in class unless directed by the class teacher.
- The booking of the school chromebooks should be the preferred option for students in class.
- If students have to use their mobile phones for an activity that cannot be completed on the chromebooks the students will follow the guidelines outlined below.
- If a student is using their mobile phone without permission in class it may be confiscated for the student and / or parent / guardian to collect in the school office at the end of the day.





#### Sixth Year

- Student mobile phones should be switched off at all times in class unless directed by the class teacher.
- The booking of the school chromebooks should be the preferred option for students in class.
- If students have to use their mobile phones for an activity that cannot be completed on the chromebooks the students will follow the guidelines outlined below.
- If a student is using their mobile phone without permission in class it may be confiscated for the student and / or parent / guardian to collect in the school office at the end of the day.

## Guidelines for the Use of Mobile Phones In Class for Certain Year Groups

Please see below some guidelines for staff on student use of mobile phones in the classroom

- Students are expected to use the student Wi-Fi when using their device for classroom tasks. The teacher will issue a unique code to the class to access this for the length of the class activity only.
- If the school's student WiFi network is down, students may use their own mobile data to access only educational and career development activities as directed by the class teacher.
- Students should have their mobile phones placed flat on the desk at all times unless otherwise directed by the teacher for a particular task under direct teacher supervision
- Students should be informed before each activity using their phone that any inappropriate use of their device may lead to sanctions up to and including suspension.



## School Activities (including games, trips etc)


- Students in First, Second & Third Year are not allowed to use their mobile phones travelling to / from any school activity or while participating in any school activity.
- If a teacher is comfortable allowing senior students to use their phones travelling to / from any school activity or while participating in any school activity then they can give them permission to do so. If a teacher isn't comfortable with this they could request that students phones remain switched off.
- In a small number of cases when junior students and senior students may be on the same bus / activity the teacher may give permission for junior students to use their mobile phones if this privilege is being extended to senior students.
- If any student is using their mobile phone without permission in class it may be confiscated for the student and / or parent / guardian to collect in the school office at the end of the day.


